Motorcycle Registration in Florida

Ready to ride your new bike down the Florida coastline? First, you'll need to make it street-legal. Here's a guide to registering your motorcycle in Florida.

New to Florida

Welcome to the Sunshine State! Upon establishing Florida residency, you'll have **30 days** to register your motorcycle with the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV).

Before you can visit your local registration office, you'll **<u>FIRST</u>** need to:

- Apply for a <u>FL motorcycle license</u>.
- Complete a vehicle identification number (VIN) inspection.
 - A <u>VIN and Odometer Verification</u> (Form HSMV 82042) form must be completed by a:
 - Police officer.
 - Car dealer.
 - Certified DMV inspector.

Once you've handled the above, head to your local FL tax collector's office with your:

- Florida motorcycle license.
- Out-of-state title and registration.
 - o If the title is currently held by a lienholder, the tax collector's office will contact them.
- Completed forms:
 - <u>Vehicle Identification Number and Odometer Verification</u> (Form HSMV 82042).
 - Application for Certificate of Title With/Without Registration (Form HSMV 82040).
- Payment for the \$82.25 new resident titling fee, plus all applicable registration taxes and fees.

How to Register a Motorcycle in Florida

In Florida, your motorcycle's registration will be **valid for 1 year**. The process for registering your new bike will differ based on how you bought it—from a **dealer**, or from a **private seller**. **Dealership Purchases**

After buying a motorcycle from a Florida dealership, the dealer has **30 days** to handle the title and registration paperwork for you. The DHSMV will then send your permanent title and registration documents to you **by mail**.

You'll pay your registration taxes and fees to your dealer—for a breakdown of what you'll owe, check out our section on <u>motorcycle registration fees</u>. Private Purchases

When purchasing a **motorcycle from a private seller**, you'll need to complete the **transfer of title and registration** yourself.

Head to your local county tax office and:

- Provide a **bill of sale**.
 - Check out our <u>Bill of Sale Requirements</u> page for a full breakdown of what you'll need on the form.
- Bring the completed and signed:
 - Vehicle title.
 - Application for Certificate of Title With/Without Registration (Form HSMV 82040).
 - Separate Odometer Disclosure Statement and Acknowledgement (Form HSMV 82993) IF there is no room on the title.
 - If the motorcycle has not been previously registered in FL, you will need to instead submit the VIN inspection form <u>listed above</u>.
- Pay the **\$10** base registration tax, plus all other <u>applicable fees and taxes</u>.

Motorcycle Registration Fees & Taxes

Registration fees for your motorcycle vary in Florida, based on factors such as your **license plate type**, **vehicle weight**, and others. For specific fees, <u>contact your local DHSMV office</u>.

Below are the **base taxes and fees** you can expect, before your vehicle's specifics are factored in:

- Motorcycle registration tax: \$10.
- Antique motorcycle: \$7.50.
- New title: \$77.25.
- Transferred title: \$75.25.
- Original used title fee: \$85.25.
 - This is applicable to motorcycles previously titled outside of Florida.
- Service/handling fee: \$2.50.
- Lien recording fee (if applicable): \$2.
